2003 SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES & DESCRIPTIONS

All information received will be held in strict confidence.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

- Postmarked by April 1, 2003

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants must reside within the Junction City School District.
- Individuals are not eligible who have previously received two consecutive scholarships from the Foundation. [This policy does not apply to those who have previously received a *mini*-scholarship/grant.]
- ET does not fund expenses for sports camps, foreign exchange student programs, or transportation.
- Scholarships may be used for programs at four-year colleges and universities, community colleges, trade, technical and vocational schools.
- All applicants are required to include a transcript of all course work through the last completed period, including current GPA. High school graduates are also required to include SAT and/or ACT test results.
- Some annual scholarship and endowment funds have specific eligibility requirements. Read the list of enclosed *Scholarship Descriptions* carefully.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES CHECK LIST

- Complete the *Cover Page*.
- Complete the *Data Sheet*.
- Complete *Part I-High School Seniors*
If you are a high school student attach transcript, GPA, SAT/ACT test results.
- Complete *Part I-College Students/Adults*
If you are a college student or adult returning to college attach transcript, GPA.
- Complete *Part II*.
- Complete *Part III*.
- Distribute *Part IV* to three individuals who consider you deserving of a scholarship.
- Mail the application postmarked no later than April 1, 2003 to:

SELECTION

- Scholarships are awarded on the basis of merit and application content, to the extent funds are available. Neatness, grammar, spelling and completion of the application in its entirety are important and will be considered. Points are awarded as follows:

<i>Part I:</i> Academic Achievement...1-25 points	<i>Part III:</i> Goal Statement.....1-25 points
<i>Part II:</i> Activities/Experiences.....1-25 points	<i>Part IV:</i> Recommendations...1-25 points
- All applicants will be notified of the selection committee's decision in early May. Scholarship recipients and contributors will be honored at an Awards Night in mid-May. SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTIONS

May 1, 2003

ANNUAL/DESIGNATED SCHOLARSHIPS

JUNCTION CITY [BPW] BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONAL WOMEN'S SCHOLARSHIP

One scholarship is to assist an adult woman continue a higher education. A second scholarship is available to a graduating Junction City High School senior.

JERRY BROWN COMPANY SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship awarded to an outstanding Junction City High School graduating senior with a 3.5 average GPA or better. Should be a well-rounded person who is involved in school and community activities.

COUNTRY COACH PROFESSIONAL/TECHNICAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships to graduating Junction City High School seniors. One scholarship is intended for a son or daughter of a Country Coach Junction City employee. If an employee's child does not apply, the first scholarship like the second, may be awarded to any graduating senior who qualifies. Suggested fields of study are diesel tech, welding, paint and body, computer assisted drafting, auto tech, aviation, refrigeration/air conditioning/heating, or RV tech.

ROB AND CHERI DICKMAN / LES SCHWAB SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship to a graduating Junction City High School senior, with a 3.0 GPA or better, to provide a business oriented, educational opportunity.

KIWANIS OF JUNCTION CITY SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship to be awarded to a Junction City High School graduating senior who wants to further his or her education by attending a vocational/technical school. The recipient must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and must have been an active participant in community service activities.

JUNCTION CITY LIONS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship to assist a Junction City High School graduating senior.

LOCHMEAD DAIRY SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship to assist a Junction City High School graduating senior.

LOCHMEAD FARMS SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship is available to any Junction City High School graduating senior.

STROME-FISHER FARM SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship awarded to a Junction City High School graduating senior who wishes to continue with agriculture or an agriculture-related field as a career. Qualifications include: minimum two years active FFA involvement, participation in other school community activities, and summer employment in agriculture or an ag-related field. The selected scholarship recipient's application requires review and approval by the contributors.

TIGER ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP FUND

To be awarded to a Junction City High School graduating senior, with first preference going to a senior whose parent/guardian is a Junction City High School alumnus.

SOROPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL OF JUNCTION CITY

Scholarship to a man or woman who has successfully completed one or more years of college with a GPA of at least 2.5. Applicant must present a plan of study (not to exceed 250 words) with a personal statement of goals, which includes participation in activities: school, civic, work and/or volunteer. Applicant must present letters of recommendation from non-relatives. Applicant must show proof of full-time student status (enrolled in at least 12 hours) at an accredited institution.

LUCILE & ELMER ANDREWS FAMILY FUND

Funding for a special education student.

TRI-COUNTY NEWS SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship available to a current-year Junction City High School graduate planning to major in journalism, photojournalism or publication graphic arts at a four-year college or university, community college or art institute; with preference given to applicants who have worked in the high school publications program.

LEE CHASE CROSSMAN SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship available to a current-year Junction City High School graduate with a minimum GPA of 3.5. Preference will be given to a student who plans to pursue a medical professional degree and has a science oriented background.

SCANDINAVIAN FESTIVAL ASSOCIATION SAINT LUCIA SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Involvement in the SFA and the general community, letter of recommendation from someone aware of the recipient's Festival involvement, plus a short essay on what the Festival means to the recipient. Applications are due mid-October of student's senior year, decision announced in mid-November. Recipient would be available (but not required) to participate in Yule events in early December as Saint Lucia Ambassador and at the Scandinavian Festival in early August. Scholarship money awarded in September when student begins college.

ENDOWMENT FUND SCHOLARSHIPS

BROOKS MIKKELSEN ENDOWMENT

Scholarship awarded to a graduating senior or continuing college student; preferably one interested in agriculture, business, or music.

HOWARD GIBSON FAMILY ENDOWMENT

Scholarship awarded to an outstanding graduating high school senior who is involved in school and community activities, who understands government structure and political systems, and who shows promise of succeeding in earning a college level degree in the agriculture or business field. Ideally, the recipient has succeeded in the FFA on the parliamentary procedure team. The recipient must have a minimum GPA average of 3.2 and minimum SAT scores of 900.

SOROPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL OF JUNCTION CITY ENDOWMENT

To assist an adult woman, 25 years or older, to continue a college degree. If unable to meet the age requirement, the criteria may be lowered to age 21.

LARRY BROWN – JERI BEARD ENDOWMENT

To assist Junction City School District residents or staff with educational opportunities.

STARNS FAMILY ENDOWMENT

This scholarship should be awarded to a person of integrity with a determination to pursue additional education beyond high school that will improve their likelihood of success.

BETTY PITNEY MEMORIAL ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIP FOR L.C.C.

Consideration will be given, first, to an adult woman 19 years of age or older seeking education or returning to Lane Community College; (2) secondly, to a graduating Junction City High School senior woman who will be attending Lane Community College; and (3) finally, if no one qualifies in the above categories, it may be awarded to any Junction City High School graduating senior who will be attending Lane Community College. Involvement in community and school activities, especially FFA, music and drama, will be considered.

EDUCATION TOGETHER FOUNDATION ENDOWMENT

Scholarship is available to any Junction City High School graduating senior or Junction City School District resident desiring further education/training.

COMMUNITY MEMORIAL ENDOWMENT

Scholarship is available to any Junction City High School graduating senior or Junction City School District resident desiring further education/training.

GAYLE DENISON STROME ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIP FUND

To be given to an outstanding mathematics student or physical science student (physics or chemistry).

DEAN MOES COMMUNITY ENDOWMENT FUND

Scholarship is available to a Junction City High School graduating senior who attended JCHS for at least 3 years. Preference will be given to a student who has experienced death in their immediate family with a minimum GPA of 2.5. If none apply, may be awarded to any senior with 3.0 GPA minimum.

BUD AND BETTY CARPENTER ENDOWMENT FUND

Scholarship is available to a Junction City High School graduating senior who attended JCHS all 4 years who plans on attending a community college or technical school preference will be given to a student who attended Junction City Schools all 12 years and is in need, if need is known by committee.

MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

GARY BUTLER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship awarded to a Junction City High School graduating senior who participates in high school athletics. Other qualifications might include an active, athletic lifestyle, and a desire to work with children in the future.

SUSIE IRWIN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship awarded to a Junction City High School graduating senior who exhibits the following qualities: enthusiasm, determination, ability to inspire, well-rounded person with varied interests, responds positively to challenges, deals positively with obstacles, demonstrates school spirit, and shows an interest in and a respect for others.

JIM PAULL MEMORIAL FUND

To assist Junction City School District residents or staff with educational opportunities.

JIM HIGGINS SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Scholarship awarded to a Junction City High School senior with a minimum of two years of active FFA membership that includes FFA leadership involvement, with an emphasis on communication skill. The recipient must have a minimum GPA average of 2.5. A major in agriculture is preferred, but not required.

JUSTIN MOORE MEMORIAL FUND

Scholarship is available to a high school senior involved in sports, one season or more, preferably soccer or basketball, with a 2.5 to 3.5 GPA. Preference will be given to a student who has attended Grades K-12 in the Junction City school district, and/or is from a single parent home.

RALPH BRUNSCHEON MEMORIAL FUND

Scholarship awarded to a graduating senior or continuing college student.

G. ANDREW ZIMMERMAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship awarded to a Junction City High School graduating senior who has a 3.0 GPA and who plans on attending a four-year college or university with a major in business or accounting.

MICHAEL T. DUBROWA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship is available to a Junction City High School graduating senior in order to continue their education in the field of social sciences or the pursuit of social justice.

GRANT SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

WEYERHAEUSER COMPANY FOUNDATION

For the third year, the Weyerhaeuser Company Foundation, on behalf of Trus-Joist, a Weyerhaeuser company in Junction City, has granted the Education Together Foundation \$3,000. Their generous gift will be used to provide scholarships of varying amounts to Junction City High School graduating seniors and/or Junction City School District residents.
